For at-risk children outside preschool, accessing science activities depends almost entirely on parents-but many parents have



limited skills for supporting such learning. PBS station WGBH has recently launched a series of free family apps based on the Emmy Award-winning preschool science series, PEEP and the Big Wide World. The apps were developed to be used jointly by parent and child for a shared learning experience. Available on Google Play and the App Store in both Spanish and English, PEEP Family Science apps cover the topics of shadows, sound, color, and ramps, respectively. 
The AACCAA's Board of Directors is sponsoring a raffle to raise money for programs that support Anne Arundel County residents living in poverty.
