Community Assistance Network Serves Record Numbers!



















From March 2020 through November 2021, CAN's Food Pantry served over 10,000 people with enough food for over 800,000 meals! Their Shelters remained operational, and they were able to place 75% of their residents in permanent housing. CAN's Community Resource Specialists are now dealing with the long-predicted tsunami of Baltimore County residents eviction. In the 3 months of September, October, and November alone CAN assisted 186 families with just under \$1 million in funds for eviction prevention. In a typical year CAN assists 150-200 people!

In June 2021 CAN began their Food Pantry and Office Renovation/Expansion Project and they are now in the second phase. Through this renovation, CAN will be providing the community with a new "Customer Choice" food pantry (think small grocery store). Visit CAN to learn more at their **website** or on **Facebook!**

TESS 'Seniors Social' Group Celebrates The Season

Activities for the Seniors Social program hosted by the <u>Takoma-East Silver Spring</u> (TESS) Community Action Center have been greatly impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Prior to COVID-19, twenty or more seniors used to meet monthly at TESS for lunch, socializing, and learning about community resources and connections. In-



person gatherings have since been focused on essentials, such as distributing food in the parking lot outside TESS. At the same time, the Long Branch Recreation Center is sheltering County residents who are experiencing homelessness during the pandemic. However, with partnerships and creativity, two recent in-person gatherings--a Thanksgiving lunch and a Holiday social--have given these seniors a lot to celebrate. 

Thursday, January 13th at 5:30 PM


UPO is committed to improving the lives of the District's residents. One way is to bring together thought leaders to address major concerns.
