Renovations are officially complete at the **Community Assistance Network's Dundalk location**. A grand opening was held at the new facility Monday, May 9th, 2022.

Mitch Posner, Executive Director of CAN. said that the center wasn't an appropriate space for employees "...and for the clients...it just was not a place that people could feel any kind of self-respect to come and get the help we could

provide them." Along with a dignified facility, visitors can get exactly what they need. "In the past, people would come out to get a box of goods, miscellaneous products. We deal with a lot of different needs out here, we have hypertension needs, diabetics, and some of the food, they just couldn't use," said **Keith Shapiro, CAN Board Chairman**. "Now, people could get out and come and grocery shop, and pick out exactly what they want."

Raising a middle-class child will likely cost almost \$286,000, according to USDA data

Raising children is expensive in the United States, and families are feeling the pressure. More than 12.5 million children in the U.S. live in poverty. Even middle-class families are increasingly struggling to pay for everyday expenses. The U.S. Department of Agriculture published a report using 2015 data that estimated expenses of child

rearing from <u>birth through age 17 in a middle-income family of two adults and two children</u> <u>is \$233,610</u>. With inflation, that number translates to almost <u>\$286,000</u> in 2022.

NCAP LGBTQIA+ Policy Brief

Ensuring that all members of the LGBTQ+ community have access to programs and services that are offered in inclusive, welcoming settings is crucial to addressing the causes and conditions of poverty. CAAs and State



Associations have a crucial and powerful role to play in their communities by providing those services and advocating at all levels of government to move policies forward that improve the lives of LGBTQ+ people in all communities. Click here for more information.

The poverty rate among individuals identifying as LGBTQ+ is considerably higher than their non-LGBTQ+ counterparts (21.6% and 15.7%, respectively). Poverty rates are even higher among some groups within the community, including transgender individuals (29.4%), Black LGBTQ+ individuals (30.8%), and LGBTQ+ individuals living in rural communities (26.1%). This has compounded disparities in areas like housing, employment, health care access, food insecurity, and policing. Check out NCAP's LGBTQIA+ Policy Brief to learn more!
